## PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is with immense pride and satisfaction I present to you the 113<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the Sydenham Cricket Club.

I was recently in a discussion about what is the mark of a successful cricket club. A well stocked trophy cabinet, the number of representative players and strong premier team were obvious suggestions. While all of these are valid, other things need to be added to the list. These include the quality of playing and training facilities, strong administration and a desire to develop the game throughout the club and the wider community. Of course, these latter attributes will contribute to achieving the former.

A cursory glance at the past three years reveals that Sydenham has taken huge strides in all of these areas and is generally regarded in cricketing circles as a 'successful' club. What excites me however has been the progress we have made towards potentially being Christchurch's most successful club, if such a thing exists. We are starting to see the fruits of a strong junior section, our club administration has significantly improved and the Premier side has gained the respect of its opposition and reached the stage where it expects to win all of its games. Complementing these has been the significant progress being made on the redevelopment of the Clubrooms and the quality of our wickets and outfield.

All of this is down to the efforts of people who are passionate about Sydenham Cricket. From the Trust, the Committee and team captains, to the managers and coaches of our junior teams, Sydenham is well served by individuals dedicated to making the Club successful. From my perspective, it has made the job of being your President much easier, and a feature of this year has been the greater sharing of responsibility among the Committee.

All of the Committee, and many others too numerous to mention individually have made a valuable contribution. I have especially appreciated the support of Ben Larter in his role as Club Captain and he in particular has taken a huge load off my shoulders. Andrew Chisnall, his partner Joy, and Korinna Whitworth have maintained high standards of management in a substandard kitchen and Tony Danenberg, Craig Ross and Mike Shrimpton have put an incredible amount of time into improving the existing facilities. Peter Robbins put a lot of extra effort into the wickets and we are going to miss his services this season. Bede Oulaghan and Dave Gallop have at last got our account to the stage where we have some, and Ben Rapson made a good start in his role as Secretary.

Mike Percy deserves special mention. As Immediate Past **P**resident he has continued to put an extraordinary amount of time into the Club and richly deserves the Life Membership conferred upon him earlier in the year. Not only has he led the clubrooms redevelopment project, but has continued to assist in other areas of club administration as well.

Turning to the redevelopment project, it is pleasing to see the traction made under Mike's leadership in the past twelve months. Detailed plans have been drawn up, a legal entity to manage the facility established, and a grant of \$150 thousand received from the Canterbury Community Trust. This has been an incredible effort and the Club is indebted to Mike and his team for driving this important project. More is explained on this project in other sections of the report.

I look forward to watching the Club make further progress in the coming season.

## SENIOR MEN TEAM REPORT

Without question the 2008-9 season for the Sydenham senior season met most expectations, winning the 20-20 competition and challenging two of the stronger clubs in the two day competition. To finish in the top three was commendable effort and without the collusion from Old Boys in their final match, Sydenham would have gained runner up status.

For the first time in the last four seasons there has been genuine competition for selection in the first team, and importantly, Andrew Thin`s leadership for the second team provided much needed support for those unable to gain senior selection, indicating clear evidence of growing depth within the club.

On a personal level Ben Orton had an outstanding season for the club scoring three centuries, while there were determined efforts from Ben Rapson, Paul McCarthy, and Craig Ross with the bat, Chris Cooper, Craig, Ben Larter and Amandeep Singh all provided pleasing performances through out the season with the ball.

In the coming season there is the opportunity for the younger players; Simon Wraight, Liam Crowley, Peter Young-Husband and Les Humphris to take their chances and cement their positions in the team rather than playing a supporting role. In short, talent now needs to be converted into performance.

This past season, the upper order batsmen have not always dominated with the bat, many getting into double figures without going on, rather than setting up a platform for the middle order to build on, but they frequently had to repair the innings when early wickets were lost. An important objective of the coming season is for the upper order to control the game with greater stability and determination rather than pressuring the Syds bowlers to keep us in the game with quality performances.

What was pleasing throughout the season was the attendance at practice, which was a departure from the past, and certainly the way players supported each other on the field helped us to 'tough,' it out when the game looked like slipping away. The challenge for the captain this year is to maintain the momentum and self belief established last season, and focus on next season`s goal, which is to win the two day competition. However given our performances in recent seasons, we are going to face a more determined opposition.

Finally, on behalf of the Syds teams my thanks go to the committee, for their unstinting and much needed support.

## 2A GRADE TEAM REPORT

As the club has been without a Convenor this season, this annual report has been written by: Kerry Constable, Gear Manager.

We have now had three full seasons of playing Super-Eight and 20/20 format games at Junior Average level and this format has proved to be a good transition to the hardball grades.

We have now completed two full seasons of the “calendar year” Secondary School grade cricket, which commenced in late January 2007.

The season timing continues to cause issues with suburban clubs, with players doing a split-season when transitioning into, or out of this grade.

I would strongly urge that our club should lobby the CCA to revert to the “Traditional Season”

### Facilities

The practise nets at Sydenham Park have again proven to be a valuable and well used resource over the summer for the hard ball teams.

### Coaching

It was pleasing to see that the season’s specialist skills clinics were even more popular than last year. The clinics were run by Kevin McGowan and Chris Ferguson every Monday and Friday afternoon at Sydenham Park and have been very successful in raising the skill level of our young players. Also Emma Scarf was seconded to assist in January, February and March in response to the increased numbers.

The Christmas Holiday program was a huge success, with more numbers than ever before. A tribute to Kevin’s enthusiasm and connection with his students.

Also thanks to HowZat Matipo St, who kindly provided lanes free of charge for our club’s indoor training sessions last winter. Unfortunately, they are unable to provide the same (free) service this year, so this winter’s trainings are being held at the Sydenham nets.

We received funding for coaching for the senior club’s English import player – Chad Yates. Although we received some quality hours before Christmas, Chad's hours quickly diminished from January onwards, and the club had to refund the un-used portion of his coaching wages grant

### Girls Cricket

We had an unprecedented 5 girls teams last season.

This was due in part, to the merger with LPW girls section which formed four composite teams. We did not field a dedicated Selwyn House team this season, as those players were integrated into the composite senior traditional team.

Kevin McGowan reports that there were a few teething problems in the first season of the merger with LPW, but considers that to be a “set-up year”. He has the full support of his counter-part at LPW, and is looking forward to a successful 2009/2010 season.

### Gear

I noted at our recent end of season working bee, that we threw away very little “worn out” gear, in comparison to previous years. This is a reflection of the previous 3 or 4 years’

investment in better quality gear, which is now giving us a pay-back .... namely, a longer life span for our cricket gear inventory.

The only exception to this is the 10 custom made bags from Bag and Awning. Although the quality was good, the bags were so large, that most teams dragged the full bags across the ground, thus wearing holes through the bottom of each bag.

### Supplier rebate

For the second year running, Anderson and Hill has given our club a 5% rebate on all of our club members' private purchases. This rebate equated to around \$540 for the first year and \$598 for last year, which we used to offset against our off-season gear purchases.

### Player sponsorship

### **CHAIRMANS REPORT**

The excess of income of \$11374 is considered to be a satisfactory.

On behalf of the club we record our gratitude to Graham and Linda Harris for their ongoing support and the income from the investment was used to pay for the accommodation for Chad Yates who was the overseas professional.

In addition Graham covered the first prize in the raffle and provided support to the building committee. This season it was agreed that the total proceeds of the raffle would go to the building committee and will be covered in the Complex Accounts.

We are indebted to the continuing support of Ray & Angela Browlee Tuskers Beckenham, Peter Wilson Sandridge Hotel and Russell McKenzie St Martins New World. We also record our thanks to Andy Inness Cricket Express who continued their advertising support. In addition we record our thanks to Mike Robbins Perennial for their advertising support.

The coming season will be a very difficult year for the Trust. Sponsorship continues to be very difficult to obtain and the current economic climate creates problems. We have an investment of \$109000 with South Canterbury Finance @ 9.6% falling due on 3/9/2009. What rate we get for reinvestment is very difficult to predict but will be less than the current rate. A smaller investment with South Canterbury Finance was reinvested for 3 years @ 9%. The Harris Investment is with Westpac @ 4.25% and this will also have an impact for the coming season. The Trust has received \$40124 towards the 2009/2010 seasons costs.

The club is looking at providing accommodation for two young overseas players who are interested in seeking NZ citizen status. This will be an added cost for the coming season. Our major funders do not cover coaching wages and this could be an increased cost.

We look forward to the coming season which will provide challenges for the Trust.
